A short Introduction: ventao – Who we are and what we do

ventao is a German acronym and stands for "Association of weltwaerts Exchange Organizations in Development Cooperation". As an association of currently 37 exchange organizations, we have two main fields of action:

1. We are a so-called "quality association", which means that we are an association for sending organizations, providing services and advice on all issues regarding volunteer services to our member organizations.

2. We are also a shared interest group representing the interests of our member organizations regarding the weltwaerts program towards the Federal Ministry of Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) and other political institutions like the German Parliament.

We currently have three staff members:

Jan Wenzel, the managing director with a full-time position, who is responsible for the overall administration of our association and for the political representation.

Anette Schwitzke, the quality management consultant works 30 h/week. She supports the members with regard to questions of quality management, organizes events and writes newsletters and manuals.

Nathalie Bambalinkenga has a mini-job and supports our accounting.

1. What is an accompanying measure?

An accompanying measure is a short-term project within the weltwaerts program, which aims at improving the quality of the program itself.

Funding priorities:

- Qualification and training for mentors and partner organizations with regard to supporting volunteers
- o Cooperation and networking among partner organizations
- Stronger integration of groups, which are under-represented in the volunteer program, such as young people with a professional training, with a disability or with a non-German ethnic background.

The applications will be reviewed according to the following criteria for eligibility:

- o Needs orientation
- o Target group orientation
- o Effectiveness
- o Efficiency
- o Sustainability
- o Developmental relevance

There are two application deadlines each year for accompanying measures:

Measures that should start between May and September must be applied for by 1st January. Measures that should start between October and April of the following year can be applied for until 1st June. The BMZ will cover up to 75 per cent of the costs of an accompanying measure. The challenge is always to secure funding for the remaining 25 per cent. As a rule, the maximum amount of funding is 50.000 EUR.

The framework conditions in a nutshell

- o Two application deadlines per year: 1st of January and 1st of June
- Maximum funding of 50.000 EUR
- Funding period max. 24 months
- The Federal Ministry is covering a maximum of 75 per cent of the overall costs

2. Who can apply and how?

German sending organizations can apply for an accompanying measure alone or together with their local partner organizations. Only applicants from Germany are eligible, i.e. all charitable sending organizations that are recognized as part of the "weltwaerts" program or sending organizations and their associations (such as ventao), as well as recognized charitable associations of returning volunteers.

Many sending organization do have experiences with this instrument. Please note, however, that the administrative effort for the instrument may be considerable, including a lengthy application process with many inquiries from the donor and little planning security.

3. Examples of accompanying measure from within ventao

- Seminars for mentors in Germany or in the host countries with the aim to strengthen mentoring skills and discuss common challenges
- Partner workshops on different topics, such as the weltwaerts quality system
- Regular visits of weltwaerts partners and the projects hosting volunteers by German partners
- Visits of local partners to Germany to attend volunteer preparation seminars and enhance the understanding of how the German partners work
- Support for South-South cooperation and emerging networks of partner organizations and host projects
- Orientations for host families and development of a host family manual
- Outreach measures (e.g. informational events) to increase the percentage of underrepresented volunteers (e.g. with a professional training)

4. Key documents

So far, the key documents relating to accompanying measures are only available in German.
